Official's Prerequisites

All positions: The Official should begin on-deck training as soon as possible following a clinic, preferably within 90 days. If circumstances do not allow that, then contact your Area Officials Chair for guidance.

Stroke and Turn, Electronic Timer

- 1. USA Swimming Registration;
- 2. USA Swimming Background Check;
- 3. USA Swimming Athlete Protection Training;
- 4. CDC or NFHS Concussion training; and,
- 5. Stroke & Turn or Electronic Timing Clinic.

Starter:

- 1. Current USAS Registration, Background check, Athlete Protection Training, Concussion Training
- 2. Certified as Stroke and Turn for 1 year;
- 3. Minimum of 10 sessions as Stroke and Turn, at multiple pools; and;
- 4. Starter Clinic, with recommendation of a Referee and Area Officials Chair approval.

Referee:

- 1. Current USAS Registration, Background check, Athlete Protection Training, Concussion Training (concussion training annually)
- 2. Referral from a member of the Official's Committee;
- 3. Certified as Starter for 1 year;
 - a. 20 sessions as Starter.
 - b. 10 of these sessions heavy in B/C swimmers.
 - c. A track record of consistently working at multiple pools.
- 4. Stroke and Turn Trainer;
- 5. Starter Trainer recommended;
- 6. At least 4 sessions as Chief Judge at OSI Championship meets during the approximately one year prior to beginning Referee training; and, at minimum,
 - a. 2 Prelims sessions
 - b. 2 Finals sessions
- 7. Referee Clinic. Participation in the annual OSI Fall "Swimposium" is strongly preferred for Referee training clinic. Initiate any request for exception with your Area Officials Chair.
- 8. Non-Starting Referee
 - a. Officials Committee may grant under exceptional circumstances, such as a disability.
 - b. Certified as Stroke and Turn 3 years;
 - c. Starter training observing starts and interacting with Referee; and,
 - d. May not be a Starter Trainer.

Administrative Official:

- 1. Current USAS Registration, Background check, Athlete Protection Training, Concussion Training
- 2. Certified as Electronic Timer;
- 3. 8 sessions as Electronic Timer, at least one of which must not be hosted by the ET's home club; and,
- 4. Administrative Official Clinic, with AO recommendation and Area Officials Chair approval.
