| LOCATION: | Amazon Pool 2600 Hilyard Eugene, OR 97405 |
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| FACILITY: | 50-meter outdoor pool, 8-lane, with 9 feet wide lanes. 25 -yard outdoor 2 lane warm-up and cool down pool. Depth 3.6-13.2 ft. Starting blocks at the deep end. Touchpads at both ends. Colorado timing system. Facility has accessibility for adaptive swimmers. Facility and team will assure these dimensions are correct. |

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| OFFICIALS: | We always appreciate the help of certified officials from other clubs. The officials' uniform will be white shirts, black shorts/pants/skirt with black shoes. |
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| ELIGIBILITY: | Swimmers must be currently registered with USA Swimming. No on deck meet registration will be permitted. Swimmers must be within the listed age brackets as of the first day of the meet. |
| HOSPITALITY: | Full hospitality will be provided at this meet. |
| SWIMMERS WITH DISABILITIES: | Swimmers with disabilities are welcome to enter this meet. The coach or team entry person must alert the meet director and the meet referee as to the need for any special accommodations or seeding arrangements at the time the entry is submitted. |
| ENTRIES: | Any swimmer entered in the meet must be certified by a USA Swimming member coach as being proficient in performing racing starts or must start each race from within the water. When unaccompanied by a member-coach, it is the responsibility of the swimmer or the swimmer's legal guardian to ensure compliance with this requirement. <br> - Submit LCM times only for seeding. NT will be accepted <br> - Submit entries via E-mail in a Hy-Tek formatted file in addition to a PDF entry list by name. Please submit payment after entries have been confirmed. <br> - Submit entries to: meetdirector@teameugene.org <br> - With submission of entries the coach/team representative attests that all swimmers entered are registered with USA Swimming. |
| ENTRY DEADLINE: | Entries will be accepted beginning May 3rd, 2024 at 12:00 PM. Entries will be accepted in the order received. Entries are limited to the 4 hour rule for each session. Updates to the entries of teams already accepted into the meet may be made up to the entry deadline, however they are subject to time constraints and not guaranteed - please contact meetdirector@teameugene.org before submitting a revised entry file. Entries must be received no later than 11:59 pm on June 20th, 2024. Teams are encouraged to submit entries as close to the entry opening time as possible to ensure entrance into the meet. Invited Teams will be notified via email when sessions are closed. |
| ENTRY LIMIT: | Session limit of 3 individual events and 1 relay per session. Entries in all relays and individual events 400 Yards and longer may be limited to adhere to the 4 hour rule or any other session timeline limits. |

| NO COACH PRESENT: | For unattached swimmers or swimmers whose coach is not attending the meet, it is the swimmer's responsibility to arrange for a certified coach to be responsible for the swimmer. This must be done BEFORE the swimmer may enter the water for warm-ups or competition. Please see the Meet Director or the Meet Referee if assistance is needed upon arrival at the meet. |


| WARM-UP: | Oregon Swimming Safety Guidelines and Warm-up Procedures are in effect at this meet. Warm-ups are subject to the following procedures: <br> - Warm-up lanes may be assigned depending on the number of swimmers entered. There is a second small pool available for general warm-up as well. The small pool will also be available through the meet for warm-up and cool down. <br> - Start and pace lanes will be determined based on need during each session. <br> Note: Swimmers violating safety procedures may be removed from the warm-up for the remainder of the warm-up session. Subsequent violations may cause the swimmer to be removed from the remainder of the meet. |  |  |  |  |

| TIMELINE: | The Meet Director reserves the right to change warm-up times if needed. All coaches will be informed of any changes to warm-up and competition times. The Meet Director reserves the right to remove or lengthen breaks written in the sanction as deemed appropriate for the success of the athletes. Timelines are for reference only and the meet may be running ahead or behind the timeline. Swimmers are responsible for getting to their heat in time for the start. |  |  |  |  |
| HEAT SHEETS: | Heat sheets with timelines will be available on the TEAM website in the 'Events' section prior to the meet. |  |  |  |  |
| MEETINGS: | Coaches meetings will be held, if needed, 15 min prior to the start of each session. Officials meetings will be held 1 hour prior to the start of each session. |  |  |  |  |
| TIMERS: | The meet will be run with two manual watches and buttons per lane in addition to a fully automated timing system. Timing sign ups can be found near the spectator entrance. |  |  |  |  |
| RULES: | Current USA Swimming and Oregon Swimming, Inc. rules will govern this meet. All walkways around the pool and lifeguard stations must be kept clear. Any act of theft, vandalism or similar action will result in immediate disqualification from the meet and the loss of any points accumulated toward team standings by the individual. Oregon Scratch Rules will not be enforced for this meet, however we would greatly appreciate notification of all scratches ahead of time. |  |  |  |  |


| FORMAT: | 10 \& under sessions will be timed finals <br> - Time finals and swum combined age and gender. <br> - The 400 will be deck-seeded, everything else will be pre-seeded. <br> - Results will be separated by age and gender for scoring and awards. <br> 11 \& over sessions: <br> - The 800 and 400 s will be deck-seeded timed finals, and swum in the preliminary sessions combined by age and gender. Results will be separated by age and gender for scoring and awards. <br> - Individual events 200 meters and shorter will be prelims-finals format and pre-seeded and swum combined by age and gender in prelims. Finals events will be swum and scored separately by age and gender, with A\&B finals in each gender and age group (11-12, $13-14$, and 15\&O.) <br> - Individual events 800 meters and longer will swum fast to slow. All other individual events will be swum slow to fast. <br> - All relay events will be deck seeded and swim slow to fast. In order to score, relays must be composed entirely of swimmers in the same age group (11-12, 13-14, 15\&O.) Non-scoring relays may be formed of swimmers in different age groups. |
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| CHECK-IN AND SCRATCHING | - Scratches for deck-seeded individual events 400 meters and longer will be due 15 minutes before the session starts and before the coaches meeting. <br> - Coaches will be provided with reports on which to scratch relays and make changes to relay names. Relay reports are due by 30 minutes after the start of warmups for the session in which the relay is swum. <br> - Oregon scratch rules will not be in effect for this meet. Please submit scratches for finals within the 30 minute window in order to give all eligible athletes a chance to complete in finals. |
| AWARDS AND SCORING: | - Medals \& Ribbons <br> - Medals will be awarded for 1st-3rd place and ribbons for 4th-12th place by gender in the above age groups for all individuals and relays. <br> - High Point Towels High point towels will be awarded to the top overall point scorers in the following age groups: Girls and boys $8 \& U, 9-10,11-12,13-14$, and 15\&O. <br> - Individual Scoring by gender and age group (8\&U, 9-10, 11-12, 13-14, and 15\&O) Individual 1st-12th: 16, 13, 12, 11, 10, 9, 7, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 <br> - Relay Scoring by gender and age group (8\&U, 9-10, 11-12, 13-14, and 15\&O) - Relays 1st-8th: 32, 26, 24, 22, 20, 18, 14, 10 |


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| RESTRICTIONS: | No Technical Suit may be worn by any 12 \& Under USA Swimming athlete member in competition at <br> any Sanctioned, Approved or Observed meet. Tobacco, non-tobacco, vapor products of any kind, <br> alcoholic beverages, and glass containers are not allowed in the swimming venue. NO SHAVING <br> PERMITTED in the venue. Use of audio or visual recording devices, including cell phones, is not <br> permitted in changing areas, rest rooms or locker rooms. Deck changing is prohibited. Please change <br> in designated changing areas or locker rooms only. No cell phones or other recording devices are <br> allowed behind the blocks. Operations of a drone, or any other flying apparatus, is prohibited over <br> the venue (pool, athlete/coach areas, spectator areas and open-ceiling locker rooms) any time <br> athletes, coaches, officials and/or spectators are present. |
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| SAFETY: | Oregon Swimming Safety Rules and Current USA Swimming Rules, including the Minor Athlete <br> Abuse Prevention Policy ("MAAPP"), will govern this meet. |
| All applicable adults participating in or associated with this meet, acknowledge that they are subject <br> to the provisions of the USA Swimming Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy ("MAAPP"), and that <br> they understand that compliance with the MAAPP policy is a condition of participation in the <br> conduct of this competition. |  |
