This meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by General Chair Shelly Rawding, who welcomed the attendees via Zoom conference call. Shelly congratulated the athletes on a successful online Athlete Leadership Summit held this last weekend.

Pull from the consent agenda was Operational Risk, and the Personnel Committee reports will be put under New Business. Shelly asked for an update about the Athletes Summit as well. The group wished a 9Happy Birthday today to Debbie Laderoute!

Operational Risk	Russ Scovel gave his PowerPoint report. He shared the overall USA Swimming pie chart for injuries/ occurrences year to date through July 14, 2020. We had one injury that was serious with a hospital visit. Most Oregon injuries occur at meets (45 percent during meets); many happen during competition, with still a high percentage during warm-up's- we had 14 total injuries in Oregon to date. Russ did get the funds for new CPR equipment, and thanked OSI. He has conducted a training review course, complying with COVID-19 rules. About four members were able to attend. Shelly asked about future training, he will work with people and do more training as needed. Coaches should contact him. Mark Rieniets brought up our risk for coach members/ OSI conducting practices with COVID-19 rules. Shelly Rawding said that it is difficult to establish standard rules as every facility is different. Mark added that the Newberg baseball team all got infected and are now sidelined. Jackie Allender said that we should be following the strictest USA Swimming guidelines. Russ Scovel added that pool facilities are required to have monitors, which led to discussion about who would be considered a practice monitor, and rules for lifeguards. Also discussed was reporting and how enforcement might occur if teams are not being compliant. After further discussion it was decided to adhere to the USA Swimming guidelines, to be adopted by each team to comply with each pool's specific regulations at this time. Shelly Rawding suggested that we think about this and discuss at the next meeting, as well as publishing the USA Swimming COVID-19 return to practice guidelines link in the OSI Newsletter in the interim.

Athletes	Quinn Brown reported on the online Athletes Leadership Summit. About 36 Good		
Leadership Summit	athletes attended. Presenters included Kathy Wikstrand for Leadership, Bridgett Dwyer on DEI, Allison Schmidt for Mental Health/ Her Swim Journey. Quinn said it was a great opportunity - she had a lot of fun and got good feedback from the attendees. The summit is recorded, however there may be issues with rules for sharing the materials by publishing the slides on our website. Quinn has sent out links for the summit to the attendees, as well as request for volunteers for the OSI junior athlete position.		

Personnel Committee

Rex Watkins gave a short update on the Personnel Committee. They have had a lot of meetings; primary work has been on job descriptions and new pathways for the way things are run at the OSI Office. They are considering changes to the office assistant position description and taking some of the present volunteer duties and adding them to the assistant job such as registrations, meet sanctions, the Team Unify website updates etc. They would consider the primary office person becoming an Executive director. They are also looking at proposing that we use a contracted service for a lot of the bookkeeping/ financial services and requirements such as the TKW company- requests have been sent to a few vendors.

The OSI Board is also very diverse in terms of members; however, in terms of the volunteer jobs some positions are not a strong suit for some people. For those volunteers their jobs should be reasonable on a monthly basis and not requiring hours of work. An executive director would help steer the organization and could take on some additional roles. Also proposed are performance improvement processes for those that are paid employees. This is still in development, so the group wants to start the conversation. Members are Fallon DeWitt, Emily Melina, Chris Pfaffenroth, Shelly Rawding and Rex Watkins.

Mark Rieniets brought up some questions in terms of required hours for positions such as the assistant position. Some of this work would include more hours seasonally i.e. such as for registration, and it would increase the budgeting to a small degree. Whether this would be in an office or online work is still up for debate in the long run.

HOD Meeting-Sunday Oct. 4th, 2020 Shelly Rawding brought up the issue of scheduling concerns regarding the annual HOD meeting along with the OSI Symposium. It is currently scheduled for the October 3-4th weekend. She is encouraging discussion for this now, to not delay preparations if we do this as an online event- we should get started now. Several LSC's have made the decision to hold theirs online this year due to the pandemic.

The OSI HOD and meeting in October will be held online only

Chris Pfaffenroth said that we should make a decision now, rather than delay the process. Lissa Parker said that she thinks it would be hard for Lincoln City to host this year, as their county is not moving forward for reopening very well. Jackie Allender made a motion to make the meeting an online virtual meeting this year. This was approved unanimously.

Rex Watkins and Russ Scovel added that it would be good to have moderators/ professional help running the meeting virtually. Mark Rieniets said that there are services that do this, and further discussion was held about Zoom licenses and ways to accomplish this. It is a good idea to have a central control room where moderators can social distance, with electronic capabilities. Victor Brasil said that materials sent out ahead that need to be voted on would be helpful. Mark Rieniets said that the company 'Election Buddy' has a good program, and delegates can be pre- enrolled.

Other education for Saturday could be developed- Julie Carpenter has been thinking about this for official's sessions- OSI has several Zoom licenses as well as each coach/ team have Zoom licenses now. Different times / days might help with this to spread out education sessions. Shelly has spoken with Jody Braden about OSCA clinics/ meetings a couple of weeks ago, he has not yet thought about it. Some added that perhaps a location such as the MAC Club could help us for the 'control room'.

Old Business		
Electronic Vote	Fallon DeWitt shared the athlete rep.'s committee electronic timeline submitted for choosing the OSI Junior Athlete representative and explained the process. Presently they have six applications that have applied for the position. They are continuing with reminders via Instagram and in the OSI Newsletter. The position closes August 2 nd . One team rep. per team ultimately votes on the final candidate. September 1 st the junior rep. then assumes the position. Shelly explained some of the recent OSI changes in this process- the athlete committee sends the names to the Board ahead to look over some of these candidates. Fallon explained that the Board is only looking at the candidates rather than choosing them- in case there is a candidate that might not be a good fit. Some questions were raised about conflict of interest, and the criteria of how the athlete committee chooses the candidate- there should be some criteria and guidelines. Fallon said that the athlete committee are developing what they want in a rep. before they look at the candidates. Some changes were made to the timeline wording that Fallon presented for clarification.	Ongoing

Oregon City Level Status	Shelly said that the Oregon City Swim Team has achieved a Level One grant-however the OSI \$1,000 benefit could be affected by the timing. They had achieved Level One the day after it was approved by the Board, but not yet announced in the OSI Newsletter until the following day. USA Swimming gave the Level One designation to OCST on Thursday- after OSI approved this benefit to clubs the day before on Wednesday. A motion was made and approved to give OCST the \$1,000 benefit. Chair Report - Shelly Rawding

I passed most of the chair duties in June to our Admin Chair, Senior Chair and Coaches Rep the past few weeks while I dealt with some family issues. A huge Thank you! to Christopher, Emily, Jody, and Debbie for jumping in as asked.

A couple things I do have to report – I received an email from Sarah (Johnston) Hilderbrand. She said: Every few years I check the record books to see how many I have left on the books (Hilderbrand, formerly "Johnston" with some 8&U records from 1982) I think it would be really amazing if some of us "old timers" could be connected with new record breakers. I think of Sue Habernigg, David Garcia, Amy Ward...and others like myself, who have records still standing from the 70's and 80's. I know I was inspired to break records and held the record-holders in awe...that were a few years old, much less decades years old.

I have responded back very positively to her note, and we will keep her in mind as a mentor for our athletes in some worthwhile capacity in the future.

And in thinking about our HOD Meeting in October, it is only 3 months away. If we need to move the meeting to an online format, I believe 3 months lead-time in order to have an effective use of everyone's time is not too

Sanctions Chair Report - Murilo Martins

I would like to share with you that your decision to extend the meet bid to August 31st was the right move. As of now, we still have no idea what we might be able to do with regards to swim meets in the fall and winter. Many teams are still not back to their pool and won't know what their facilities will allow them to host until they are back, and new guidelines are available. Since our meet calendar is designed for open meets and large invitationals (you don't have to bid for intra-squad, dual, tri and quad meets), the teams that are back in the water can start playing with smaller meets as long as those meets are not open or invitations with 5+ teams.

One issue that has been brought up by the Corvallis Aquatic Team is that they would like to know asap if they will be able to host a state championship meet since their facility is currently planning out for the whole fall/winter. I'm not opposed to starting the championship meet bid with a short deadline of 2 weeks in order to make sure we don't lose a team that has been hosting our championship meets for years. As for the other teams that might not know if their facility will support their bid for championships, they can always bid for the meet and if they win and their facility chooses not to host, they can give the meet up later.
